








A June 2018 assessment, conducted as part of the Government's Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF), judged that we deliver high-quality teaching and learning. Key findings were that we had demonstrated evidence of:

- a commitment to raising social mobility and student aspirations
- embedding employability to enable students to acquire the knowledge, skills and understanding that are highly valued by employers
- learning support which promotes high levels of engagement and commitment to study
- student and staff initiatives in research and scholarship
- physical and digital resources that are used by students to enhance their learning

The TEF is the first Government-led exercise to evaluate the quality of the student experience in universities and colleges offering higher education programmes. It has been introduced so that prospective students are better informed.

All providers of higher education have been awarded a specific rating based on metrics which look at teaching quality, learning environments and graduate outcomes. DCG received a TEF Silver award.





PROMOTING SCHOLARSHIP

As a lead college in the National Scholarship Project, we engage our staff and students in research and learning at a high level. You will develop scholarship skills such as problem-solving, critical thinking, analysis, synthesising information, reflection and evaluation. This might be via:

The Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire Collaborative Outreach Programme (DANCOP) pools a wealth of knowledge and expertise to inform learners about all aspects of higher education, including college-based provision and Higher and Degree Apprenticeships.

DCG is heavily involved in these widening participation initiatives and has established a DANCOP team based at the Roundhouse.

We have also helped run a national project to raise the number of people from under-represented groups enrolling on construction-related degrees.

The BRIDGE Project has delivered benefits for those seeking professional, technical and management jobs by providing ways to encourage people from all backgrounds, genders and ethnicities into higher education and a career in the construction industry.

OUR INNOVATION HUB

Designed specifically for our higher education students, the Innovation Hub provides a superb learning environment. It has been developed in partnership with Fujitsu and Intel to help put latest technology at the heart of your studies and boost your digital literacy.

Based at the Roundhouse, the Innovation Hub forms part of our Higher Education Centre which also features stateof-the-art classrooms, private study areas, group learning environments and social spaces.

The facility has been fitted with a range of Fujitsu and Intel hardware, including STYLISTIC tablets, LIFEBOOK laptops, and ESPRIMO desktop PCs. You and your lecturers can therefore select the devices which are best suited to your learning style.

QUALIFICATIONS EXPLAINED

It is very important that you choose a programme to suit your individual needs, abilities and aspirations. Here is a brief guide to some of the study options available in our growing higher education portfolio.

FOUNDATION AND HONOURS DEGREES

Our portfolio of degree programmes is continuing to expand, the latest additions being the Foundation Degree and BA (Hons) Creative Practice and Foundation Degree Business and Management in conjunction with The Open University.

We also have a well established range of Foundation Degrees which combine technical and professional skills. These are widely supported by employers who contribute to the development and delivery of the programmes. Once you have completed a Foundation Degree, you can often progress directly to the final stages of an Honours Degree – with DCG or at university – or you can advance to further professional qualifications.

We offer degrees validated by and in partnership with the University of Derby, Sheffield Hallam University and The Open University. You will receive your qualification from the relevant university and benefit from clear progression routes to the next stage of learning.

DCG offers degrees in Animal Management; Animal Management (Zoo and Wildlife); Business and Management; Children and Young People; Computing; Creative Practice; Engineering; Equine Science, Management and Training; Security and Offender Management; and Sport Coaching.

HNCS AND HNDS

Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs) tend to be more vocational than degrees and place greater emphasis on practice rather than theory. Highly valued by employers, they also offer an alternative route into higher education.

The HNC usually takes two years of part-time study, although DCG's flexible approach means that other study routes are often available. A HNC qualification can sometimes enable you to enter the second year of a degree programme directly.

The HND usually takes two years of full-time study, three years of part-time study or one year of part-time top-up study if you have already completed a HNC. A HND qualification can sometimes allow direct entry to the third year of a degree programme.

DCG offers HNCs and HNDs in subjects such as Building Services Engineering; Civil Engineering; Construction and the Built Environment; and Engineering.



HIGHER AND DEGREE APPRENTICESHIPS

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships are a great alternative route to achieving university-level qualifications. You will receive training up to degree level (both on and off the job), a salary and the opportunity to start moving your career forward in the right direction from the word go — all with the support of your employer and teachers at DCG.

Higher and Degree Apprenticeships form part of a Government strategy to build a well-qualified workforce trained to degree level. They can lead to further academic qualifications such as an Honours Degree or to professional qualifications that are specific to an industry – for example, engineers can take steps to achieve chartered status.

The majority of apprentices continue working towards promotion at the company with which they trained but the higher level qualification can also help you progress to another company if that is what you have in mind.

DCG supports Higher/Degree Apprenticeships for sectors such as children and young people's services; education and training; engineering; health and social care; professional construction; and retail.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

Continuing with your professional development is crucial if you want to accelerate your progress up the career ladder. You may need to improve your management and leadership skills, advance your technical know-how, add impressive new qualifications to your CV or turn your talents to teaching.

DCG offers a range of specialist programmes – at levels from 4 to 6 – for professionals progressing their careers in fields such as business and management; coaching and mentoring; children and young people's services; health and social care; professional education, training and development; personal training; and sports massage therapy.



ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

Access to Higher Education Diplomas provide you with a stepping stone to a higher level of study. They are ideal if you are considering a career change, want to return to study or feel you need a more gradual introduction to undergraduate education.

They are available to anyone over the age of 19, irrespective of previous qualifications. All Access programmes feature Maths, English, IT and Study Skills to ensure you have a good standard of general education to progress to the next stage of your learning.

DCG offers Access programmes in Health Professions; Humanities and Social Science; and Science.

ARE YOU A CURRENT STUDENT?

If you are studying with us at Level 3 and considering your next steps, we can now guarantee you direct progression to one of our higher education programmes.

Your place is secure as long as you achieve the relevant entry criteria and have a good attendance and performance record during your current DCG studies. It is also dependent on there being sufficient student numbers for the programme to run.

SUPPORTING YOUR STUDIES

A number of our programmes ask for UCAS tariff points. The UCAS tariff allows you to see if your results meet the entry requirements for a particular programme. It covers a wide range of qualifications including A-level, Scottish Advanced Higher, Scottish Higher, and BTEC awards.

CHANGES TO GCSE GRADES

New GCSE numeric grades – with 9 being the highest and 1 being the lowest – have now been introduced in England.

The Government recognises grade 4 and above as a 'standard' pass in all subjects, representing a similar achievement to the old grade C or above. For English and Maths GCSE, it also categorises a grade 5 or above as a 'strong' pass.

Do not hesitate to contact us if you need to know more about entry requirements.

NO FORMAL QUALIFICATIONS?

For many programmes, we welcome applicants who lack institutional qualifications. All such applicants will be interviewed and may be set an appropriate piece of work upon which a judgement will be made, taking into account their academic potential and relevant experience.

Access to Higher Education Diploma: Health Professions

Perfect if you are seeking a new career, this programme is your first step to a fulfilling role in healthcare professions. It develops your confidence and interpersonal skills while equipping you with the academic knowledge you need.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

This programme is designed for students who are aged 19 and over and who are considering a future career as a nurse, midwife or in related healthcare fields. You will learn through lessons, small and large group work, seminars, projects, tests and presentations. You will also be encouraged to undertake a placement within a relevant workplace setting to help you develop organisational, planning and problem-solving skills as well as the interpersonal qualities that are vital for those in caring professions.

This programme is delivered at Ilkeston College on different days and at different times which will be discussed in more detail at your interview.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

Modules include:

- Study Skills Harvard referencing, academic writing, presentation skills and Information Technology (IT) for academic study
- Biology
- Psychology
- Sociology
- Health Studies
- Maths in a Health Care context

Please note that modules may be subject to change.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will be invited to an interview to discuss your qualifications, experience and any other related issues. You are also encouraged to join an open event to discuss the programme with the tutors.

Applicants need to have at least a grade 4 (C) in GCSE English and it is advantageous to have at least a grade 4 (C) in Maths and Biology. If you do not have a grade 4 in GCSE Maths or Biology, you must demonstrate that you are working at a sufficiently competent level and you may be able to study GCSE maths alongside your Access programme.

Applicants who have not achieved English, Maths or Biology recently will have to undertake relevant assessments.

For those seeking to progress directly to midwifery, a strong GCSE profile – possibly with AS Level study – along with substantial experience in the field of healthcare will be expected.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You will be assessed using a variety of methods: assignments, practical work, reports, group presentations, poster presentations and exams (practical and theory). All assessment methods have been designed to focus on skills specific to the healthcare professions while incorporating key transferable skills

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

You will have the ideal platform for applying for Nursing and Midwifery degrees at the University of Derby, Nottingham Trent University, Loughborough University, Leicester University and De Montfort University.

You could also progress to careers centred on adult, mental health, learning disability and child nursing, midwifery, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, and roles such as operating department practitioner.

Career change proves a real tonic

"When I enrolled in 2004, I had been out of education for a long time. It had been years since I'd taken my GCSEs, so it was effectively like starting from the beginning. Without the Access programme, I wouldn't have had what it takes to go on to university and study for my nursing degree."

Derby hospital matron Louise Alberts says she owes her nursing career to DCG – after deciding on a career change when she was in her mid-30s.

Having previously worked in sales, Louise says that the turning point came after she had twins. As they grew older, she realised she did not want to go back to her old career, so she looked for a new profession that was challenging and rewarding.

She found the Access programme fitted in perfectly with school hours and went on to complete a nursing degree. She then worked as a staff nurse, junior sister and senior sister at London Road Community Hospital before being seconded to the matron role in Derby City's community services. In 2016 she became permanent matron for acute medicine for older people.



A variety of learning and teaching methods appropriate to each level will be used, from formal lectures, tutorials and supervised practical exercises through to critical reviews of the work of other practitioners and development of research techniques. The taught sessions are complemented by directed and private study done in your own time.

We are planning that our teaching, learning and assessment will be both online and face-to-face (blended). Each module will take a unique approach that best supports you in achieving the learning and assessments.

You will take part in a variety of online lectures, discussions, tutorials and activities. Our Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) will provide you with a range of resources and activities and you will engage with your peers and teachers via Microsoft Teams for a range of planned sessions.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

An agreed assessment strategy for Open University programmes has been adopted at DCG to standardise across programmes in different curriculum areas

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

You may need to provide your own materials for specific projects or purposes, such as costs associated with text books and educational visits to businesses around the UK and potentially abroad.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

After completing the Foundation Degree, you could consider progressing to a BA (Hons) Top Up qualification.

The programme is also designed to help you progress your career as a professional manager in the private, public or third sector and in any size of organisation. Specific job roles may include manager, middle manager, head of department, operations manager, business analyst, project manager, consultant, account manager, marketing and communications manager, event manager, product manager, marketing generalist and business development manager.

Professional Diploma in Accounting

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

AAT does not set any prerequisites for the study of this qualification. However, for the best chance of success, we recommend that you have a good standard of English and maths. Professional accountants work at the very heart of a business and are expected to be able to communicate information clearly and appropriately to a given audience.

Ideally, you should also have completed the AAT Foundation and Advanced Level qualifications.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

All assessments in this qualification are:

- set and marked by AAT
- computer based
- time limited

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

As part of your AAT programme, you will need to purchase resource/ text books to aid your revision. There may also be the additional cost of registration/subscription fees and exams. This can be discussed at your interview but for a general idea:

- Level 4 AAT Membership £147
- Books £128 (This is the total cost for seven tutorials and workbooks for each unit)
- Assessments £420 (Total cost for six assessments)

AAT membership and the cost of the first exams is included.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

Once qualified, you will automatically become an AAT affiliate member and, with relevant work experience, will qualify for full AAT membership. This will allow you to use the designatory letters MAAT after your name.

The AAT Professional Diploma in Accountancy can give you exemptions towards all or parts of the UK's chartered and certified accountancy qualifications. The following chartered bodies offer exemptions to AAT students:

- The Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA)
- The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW)
- The Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA)
- The Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA)
- The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland (ICAS)

The Professional Diploma can lead to employment in roles such as Accounts Payable and Expenses Supervisor, Assistant Financial Accountant, Commercial Analyst, Cost Accountant, Fixed Asset Accountant, Indirect Tax Manager, Payments and Billing Manager, Payroll Manager, Senior Bookkeeper, Senior Finance Officer, Senior Fund Accountant, Senior Insolvency Administrator, Tax Supervisor and VAT Accountant.

Diploma in Advice and Guidance

Location: Workplace

This qualification is designed to provide a statement of competence which will testify to your ability to work with practitioners and clients in delivering quality advice and quidance.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

The programme recognises that employment in the advice and guidance sectors involves a diverse range of functions, tasks and activities that are constantly developing in the light of changing client needs. It will equip you with the skills and knowledge you need to take your career forward.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

There are five mandatory units:

- Understand the importance of legislation and procedures
- Develop interactions with advice and guidance clients
- Manage personal caseload
- Evaluate and develop own contribution to the service
- Operate within networks

There is also a range of optional units you will complete. These could include themes such as liaising with other services; facilitating learning in groups; providing support for other practitioners; and undertaking research for the service and its clients. They will be decided by matching your job role to the list of optional units and selecting those for which you are able to generate evidence of your performance in the workplace.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You need to be involved in providing specialised advice and guidance services to clients. This could include offering careers education guidance, advocacy or mediation services. The range of services involved may include Government agencies, schools, colleges, universities, prison services or trade unions.

In addition to having good ICT skills, you must be willing to use and maintain an electronic portfolio of evidence.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You will be assessed on the job, using a range of methods including the production of evidence such as case histories, products of work, questions, witness testimonies, professional discussions and observations. These will be uploaded into an electronic portfolio.

Ideally you should be a practising or aspiring middle manager, project manager or departmental head. You will have an interview with a programme tutor to ensure the Level 5 Diploma is the right choice for you.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You will be assessed on your knowledge and understanding of solving work-based problems and your capacity to make decisions that are based on gathering and interpreting information and on evaluating options to determine the most appropriate solution.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

You can consider advancing to the ILM Level 7 qualification in Leadership and Management while taking your career to more senior levels.

Higher Apprenticeship – Employability Practitioner

Level: 4

Number of years: 2

Location: Workplace

Would you like to develop your career helping people into secure and sustainable employment? This Higher Apprenticeship gives you the skills and knowledge to make a major difference to people's lives.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

An Employability Practitioner works with those individuals – or service users – who are distanced furthest from the labour market, helping them to address and overcome obstacles to employment.

Employability Practitioners may work with a specific group of service users in devising strategies to tackle multiple and complex barriers to employment. Their aim is to improve each individual's employability prospects, enabling them to find work or to progress in their work if they are already employed.

The Employability Practitioner apprenticeship delivers a broad appreciation of the types of public services, community offerings and funding streams available and an understanding of how these fit together so that you can put in place a bespoke plan of support for each service user.

The apprenticeship includes 20% logged off-the-job training, an end-point assessment and Level 2 Maths and English, unless you are exempt.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will develop your knowledge and skills in wide-ranging areas such as:

- Job searches and other interventions
- Customer service
- Coaching and mentoring

You should be aged over 18 and be employed for more than 30 hours per week in an Employability Practitioner role. You should have GCSEs graded A - C (9 - 4) or Level 2 Functional Skills.

You will be assessed via observations, questioning, professional discussion, products of work, witness testimonies and external assessment. An allocated assessor will support you throughout the apprenticeship.

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

You need a laptop to access your e-portfolio.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

You could progress to a Level 5 Leadership and Management qualification and advance your career in supervisory or managerial roles.

Higher Apprenticeship – Operations/Departmental Manager

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You will work with your assessor to ensure that you have all the knowledge and behaviours to complete the end-point assessment which will consist of:

- Assessment of a portfolio of evidence
- Project proposal, presentation and question
- Professional discussion with questions and answers

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

You will need to have all personal protective equipment (PPE) required to undertake your role legally and safely.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THE PROGRAMME?

On completion of the apprenticeship, you can register as a full member of the Chartered Management Institute (CMI) and/or the Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM). Those with three years of management experience can also apply for Chartered Manager status through the CMI.

You could also consider progressing to a Level 6 qualification.

Lorna champions lifelong learning for the business high-fliers of the future



The Foundation Degree Computing (FdSc) will appeal to those already in an IT-related role or those wishing to move into this exciting, diverse sector. It also offers a platform for progression to a BSc (Hons) Computer Science.

You will develop practical skills in networking, programming, application development and web development, underpinned by academic knowledge and an understanding of software engineering and computing.

This is a work-based learning programme and our students are normally already in employment. However, if you do not work in a relevant role, we aim to provide you with realistic work-based scenarios to build your skills.

A two-year programme, the FdSc is delivered at our Joseph Wright Centre. The qualification is awarded by the University of Derby.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

- 64 UCAS tariff points of which at least 32 points must come from an IT related subject
- GCSE English and Mathematics at grade 9 4 (A* C) or equivalent qualifications

You may also be able to gain entry to Level 4 with exemptions on some of the modules, or advanced entry to Level 5, based on the evidence of other certified qualifications and experiential learning. See www.derby.ac.uk/about/organisation/academic-regulations or talk to the programme leader for further information.

We are seeking well-motivated students who wish to pursue their studies in a stimulating and vocationally orientated learning environment, and who are prepared to study both on campus and within either their own, or a nominated, real or simulated work-based learning environment.

All applicants are subject to approval from the University of Derby.



HOW WILL I LEARN?

There is an emphasis on direct technical skills. You will build knowledge and understanding of the organisation of computer systems in terms of hardware, software and data processing. There are continual forms of ongoing and final assessments and small group workshops.

Throughout, you are encouraged to develop your employability skills. You will replicate real-world practices by using specialised industry-standard tools and by completing an industry-related project. This will enable you to work in industry as a programmer, web developer, network specialist or database designer, among many other roles.

The programme is delivered two days per week, with additional independent study outside of these contact hours. It is taught by our highly qualified staff who have a wealth of industrial and academic experience.

Vanessa opens doors for a new generation of professionals to join the digital industries

Digital skills have always been a passion for Vanessa Simpson who is team manager for this curriculum area at Derby College Group.

Unique in scope and delivery, our exciting new Foundation Degree (FD) Creative Practice programme is validated by The Open University.

Featuring vibrant practical projects, it enables you to focus on your own specialism by choosing one of four strands: performing arts, music, art and fashion, or media. You will work with subject specialist tutors in these areas, building your technical and creative prowess. You will then harness these skills to collaborate with students from other disciplines to enhance your creative work and develop your employability.

What sets the FD Creative Practice apart from other more specialist programmes is the emphasis on collaborative working with students and staff from other disciplines. It enables you to broaden your skill set, cultivate good working relationships with other creative professionals, and gain a keen sense of how the different strands of the creative industry overlap and interact with each other.

We also prepare you to excel in an industry where multi-skilled, self-sufficient freelance practitioners are in demand. To help you meet this challenge, we provide commerce-related modules covering financial understanding, business planning and project management.

Assessment will be through a range of practical projects, group projects, academic writing and presentation work. Other assessment methods may be used to reflect student needs.

- Experience of riding a variety of horses in a range of environments
- 13 stone weight limit

BHS qualifications would be advantageous but not essential.

All applicants are subject to approval from the University of Derby.

All formative and summative assessment methods have been designed to focus on skills specific to the equine industry while incorporating key transferable skills.

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

You will need to purchase personal protective equipment (PPE) for practical work at a cost of approximately £100. You are also expected to contribute towards any industry-relevant trips and visits, which will cost approximately £150. These will be payable at the time of the planned trip or visit.

Optional costs include British Horse Society (BHS) membership in preparation for industry qualifications which will be offered alongside the programme. Full details of the BHS qualifications, together with the costs, are available on our website.

- have achieved a full Level 3 qualification
- have GCSE English at grade 9 4 (A* C)

A certificate for each of these qualifications will be required at your interview and can be sent via email too. If you have not completed your qualification or need to apply for a copy of a certificate, approval from the University of Derby will be provisional until a copy of each certificate is provided.

All applicants are subject to approval from the University of Derby.

The HND in Construction and the Built Environment is designed to develop your knowledge and understanding of how new and traditional technologies, management systems and scientific concepts affect the planning, design and production of construction projects.

You will also build your skills in managing health, safety and welfare during the design and production of buildings. In addition, you will become adept at working both independently and as part of a team on projects.

Our flexible programme of study allows you to fit your learning around your work and home life. It is ideal for anybody unable to commit to attending College for a full day each week.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

The HND programme consists of at least 16 units (a minimum of 240 credits).

Modules cover:

- Applied mathematics
- Management principles and application
- Measurement processes
- Technology of complex buildings
- Contractual procedures and procurement
- Conversion and adaptation of buildings

Through our VLE, you will be able to access video editing programmes and Microsoft 365 for free.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Each unit is assessed by a combination of assignments, simulated exercises, academic posters, presentations (including voice-over PowerPoint presentations and videos) and project work through the VLE.

All assessment methods have been designed to focus on skills specific to the industry while incorporating key transferable skills.



It can lead to the second or third year of an Honours Degree, depending on the match of your HND units to the programme in question.

This programme will also support your career progression to management level within the construction industry, architecture and quantity surveying.

Higher Apprenticeship – Building Services Engineering Technician

Level: 4

Number of years: 3

Location: The Roundhouse

If you aspire to success as a building services engineering technician, this apprenticeship offers the ideal 'earn-as-you-learn' route to professional recognition and career progression.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

This apprenticeship will foster your skills and knowledge so that you can:

- supervise the installation of environmental technologies in buildings
- assist design teams with building services engineering solutions on construction projects
- supervise specialist contractors
- control health and safety on construction projects
- record, control and report progress on a construction project
- minimise the environmental impact of construction projects
- control the quality of works on a construction project
- ensure compliance with contractual conditions on a project

The programme leads to a Level 4 qualification in Construction and Built Environment that meets the knowledge requirements of the apprenticeship standard and is approved by the Chartered Institution of Building Services Engineers (CIBSE). This means that you will meet the educational requirements to achieve Engineering Technician (EngTech LCIBSE) status.

The apprenticeship typically lasts for three years but the duration of your programme will depend upon your previous experience and your access to opportunities that give you the full range of competence you need.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will cover knowledge and skills in areas such as:

- health and safety
- sustainability
- · engineering principles and solutions
- project management
- planning and organising work
- monitoring quality

You will also develop behaviours and attitudes which are important to employers, including:

- professional judgement

English and Maths at Level 3 will form part of the Level 4 qualification and should be achieved before you take the end-point assessment.



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You need a minimum of five GCSEs at grade C/4 or above including English and Maths (grade 5 or above), and Science. Your grade should preferably be 6+ (B) for GCSE Maths. Alternatively you could have:

Higher Apprenticeship – Construction Quantity Surveying Technician

Level: 4

Number of years: 3

Location: The Roundhouse

Interested in a role where you can monitor and control costs and contracts on major construction projects? This Higher Apprenticeship paves the way towards professional recognition and a challenging career.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

The Higher Apprenticeship equips you to excel in roles such as assistant quantity surveyor, assistant construction surveyor, quantity surveying technician, assistant cost engineer or assistant cost analyst – roles where you could be based on sites or in offices.

It typically takes three years to complete but this will depend upon your previous experience and your access to opportunities to gain the full range of competence.

You will work towards a Level 4 HNC in Construction and Built Environment that not only meets the knowledge expected in the apprenticeship standard but is also approved by the industry's recognised professional bodies. This means the apprenticeship will include the knowledge, skills and behaviours typically required to achieve Technician status – or the equivalent – with these professional bodies.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will build knowledge and skills in:

- health and safety: gaining an understanding of the principles and responsibilities imposed by law and other regulations in a construction environment and learning how to apply your health and safety knowledge to all activities
- sustainability: appreciating sustainability issues in projects relating to economic, social and environmental factors and demonstrating how to apply the principles of sustainability
- construction technology: looking at different construction techniques and materials, exploring the principles of design, and assisting in implementing the most appropriate solutions for construction projects
- contracts: examining the range of contracts used in construction, why they
 are adopted in different situations and how to apply them
- procurement: building your awareness of the different types of procurement processes and negotiation requirements so that you can assist in the selection of – and negotiation with – specialist contractors for a construction project
- cost control: learning about the importance of controlling costs during a construction project and the effect of changes to a project, enabling you to assist in the measurement and costing of construction works
- financial reporting: assisting in the preparation of financial reports, cash flow and cost forecasts for a construction project based on a strong understanding of the various forms of reporting on project progress
- administration: helping with the collection, collation and storage of relevant data and its analysis

You will also develop behaviours including:

- commitment to a code of ethics: understanding and applying the code of conduct and conduct regulations, ethics and professional standards relevant to the industry's recognised professional bodies
- continuing professional development: identifying your own development needs and taking action to meet those needs while using your knowledge and expertise to help others when requested

- Construction Surveyor
- Cost Engineer
- Cost Analyst

You could also pursue an Honours Degree programme in your chosen professional area.

If you are keen to pursue a career where you can take responsibility for planning, preparing, managing and supervising construction projects, this Higher Apprenticeship is for you.

- assist design teams with civil engineering solutions on construction projects
- supervise specialist contractors
- contribute to the control of health and safety on construction projects
- record, control and report progress on a construction project
- contribute to the minimisation of the environmental impact of construction projects
- control the quality of works on a construction project

The programme leads to a Level 4 qualification in Construction and Built Environment that meets the knowledge requirements of the apprenticeship standard and is approved by the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE). This means that you will meet the educational requirements to achieve Engineering Technician (EngTech MICE) status.

The apprenticeship typically lasts for three years but the duration of your programme will depend upon your previous experience and your access to opportunities that give you the full range of competence you need.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will cover knowledge and skills in areas such as:

- health and safety
- sustainability
- engineering principles and solutions
- construction and construction management
- management
- planning and organising work
- monitoring quality

You will also develop behaviours and attitudes which are important to employers, including:

Number of years: 3

Location: The Roundhouse

Highly competent supervisors are needed to keep the wheels of the construction industry moving. This apprenticeship equips you for senior roles which involve significant levels of professionalism and responsibility.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

The Higher Apprenticeship prepares you to supervise specialist contractors and workers on construction projects. These roles are mainly based on construction sites, with occasional time spent in offices.

Posts associated with the programme include assistant site manager, assistant supervisor or construction site supervisor. In the case of small and medium-sized construction companies, roles are also likely to include site manager or site supervisor.

The typical duration for the apprenticeship is three years but this will depend upon your previous experience and your access to opportunities to gain the full range of competence.

Successful apprentices will gain a Level 4 HNC qualification in Construction and Built Environment that meets the knowledge requirements of the apprenticeship standard. The programme also covers the knowledge, skills and behaviours typically required to achieve Technician status or the equivalent with the industry's recognised professional bodies.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will build knowledge and skills in:

- construction management: gaining an understanding of management principles and the project management lifecycle
- planning and organising work: being able to recognise the importance of project planning and resourcing and to analyse different techniques
- monitoring quality: increasing your ability to define the quality required on a finished construction project, assessing and reporting on quality standards, and assisting in the commissioning of finished construction projects
- monitoring costs: appreciating the importance of cost control on a construction project, understanding financial and legal constraints, and measuring and recording progress against budget
- health and safety: identifying the risks of activities and encouraging all employees to demonstrate safety-conscious behaviours
- sustainability: assessing, identifying and recording the environmental impact of projects
- construction technology: assisting in implementing the most appropriate solutions for construction projects
- project management: using effective management principles and being able to supervise construction workers
- planning and organising work: understanding the overall plans for projects and measuring and recording progress against plans

You will also develop behaviours including:

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

You need safety boots and Personal Protective Equipment, such as a hard hat and overalls, which should be supplied by your employer.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

Career progression could be into roles such as:

- Construction Site Supervisor
- Construction Site Manager

You could also pursue an Honours Degree programme in your chosen professional area.

The Higher Certificate offers you the chance to acquire a qualification for teaching in the education and training sector. It is especially suitable for work-based learning practitioners delivering some off-the-job training and for workshop demonstrators or coaches. You will build an excellent toolkit for teaching, learning and assessment. Emphasis is placed on developing your practical teaching skills and engaging with educational research and theories so that you exit as a confident and able teacher or trainer. After completing your studies, you will be well equipped to embed best practice within your organisation and to contribute to increased efficiency and effectiveness of assessment and verification.

The programme is delivered through one-to-one tutorials on a flexible basis to suit your needs. Your assessor will visit you in the workplace every three to four weeks and provide advice, guidance and support to enable you to achieve this qualification.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

The programme develops your knowledge, skills and professional behaviours holistically. You will work towards achieving two units:

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You need evidence of:

- a relevant Assessor qualification
- a qualification at an appropriate level and relevant up-to-date experience in your vocational or subject-specialism
- being in a position to follow your organisation's policies and procedures
- access to at least two assessors who are assessing work-based students
- access to a qualified internal verifier to help support you in the internal verification process

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You will build a portfolio of evidence to prove competency and good practice in internal verification. This is usually completed through an e-portfolio (One File).

You can implement what you have learned in the workplace to improve practices. Coaching and mentoring are now recognised as powerful strategies for developing individuals in the workplace effectively. This ILM programme enables you to take your skills to the next level.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

The ILM Level 5 Certificate in Effective Coaching and Mentoring is an ideal qualification for people with significant responsibility for coaching and mentoring employees as part of their day-to-day role. It covers planning and preparing specific learning and development opportunities and requires you to practise your coaching skills in the workplace.

The programme is also designed to support you to move into a development role or to embark on a career as a freelance coach and mentor.

We deliver the programme using a range of ten classroom-based sessions over the eight-month period, two hours of supervision and workplace observations. It enables you to:

- develop a critical understanding of the role and responsibilities of the workplace coach and mentor
- deepen your knowledge of how coaching and mentoring can impact an organisation and individuals
- assess your own skills, behaviours and knowledge as a coach and mentor
- provide evidence of your own development as a coach and mentor through the qualification

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

The programme develops your theoretical knowledge of effective coaching skills and professional behaviours holistically. You will be working towards the following qualification units:

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All applicants must attend a bespoke information session and informal interview to discuss their qualifications, experience, workplace role, motivation and aspirations.

You need evidence of:

- a recognised Level 2 or equivalent qualification in English
- a Level 3 qualification and/or a demonstration of your ability to work at Level 5
- coaching/mentoring as part of your workplace role: you must be in a
 position to undertake a minimum of 18 hours of formal and contracted
 coaching or mentoring with supervision and support, and be able to show
 how you have reflected on your performance
- capacity to attend ten classroom-based learning sessions during the programme, take part in a minimum of two tutorials and engage in a minimum of two workplace observations/supervision
- a commitment to independent study: a key expectation to enable you to learn and achieve



HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Assessment is through coursework and an exciting range of assessment methods is used. These include observations of your practice, self-evaluation, reflective tasks, written assignments, and individual and group poster presentations. All assessment methods have been designed to focus on skills specific to the professional coach or mentor, while incorporating key transferable skills.

You are required to undertake research and write in an appropriate academic style, using Harvard Referencing systems. We will support you to develop or refresh your academic writing skills during the programme.

All assessments require you to apply theory to your own practice and you are expected to engage with academic research and learning theory.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

You could progress into a coaching or mentoring role in the workplace, including in an educational setting, or into a work-based teaching and learning role such as assessor-coach, where you use the coaching skills to develop apprentices, workplace learners and workshop learners. This Higher Apprenticeship offers you a pathway to qualifying as a teacher in the post-14 sector. It is a supportive and rigorous programme where you will earn as you learn and develop your professional practice.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

The apprentice teacher route to full qualification is a well established and innovative work-based programme. It will develop high-level skills and allow you to qualify as a teacher in the learning and skills sector which includes post-14 education (Key Stage 4 in schools).

You will earn as you learn and enjoy significant opportunities to develop your professional practice in classroom, work-based and workshop settings.

The programme develops your specific skills and knowledge in:

- educational research and applying learning to practice
- generic teaching, learning and assessment, including promoting positive behaviours for learning
- subject pedagogy
- the professional behaviours of a teacher
- safeguarding practice
- utilising digital technology

You will also improve your transferable skills in areas such as effective communication, reflective practice, building resilience, stakeholder engagement and relationship building.

This is an excellent time to consider this programme: employers in the sector are increasingly turning to Higher Apprenticeships as a means of succession planning and alleviating recruitment issues in shortage subjects.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will work towards a set of qualifications in order to evidence the apprenticeship standards and become an outstanding teacher who has a positive impact on learners in the sector.

If you have not already achieved the following qualifications, you are required to gain:

- a full teaching qualification (Certificate in Education) at Level 5 (awarded by the University of Derby)*
- a Level 2 Award in Prevent and Safeguarding strategies, with a whole unit devoted to anti-radicalisation

In addition to mandatory qualifications, you may wish to enhance your studies by undertaking optional short courses in:

- Coaching and Mentoring
- Understanding Specific Learning Difficulties
- * subject to approval

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You need:

- a teacher apprenticeship contract covering a minimum of 2.5 years to enable an end-point assessment following two years of learning
- evidence of a Level 3 (at least) qualification in your own subjectspecialism
- evidence of approved Level 2 qualifications in English Language and Maths
- a mentor in your organisation to support your development

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Assessment is robust, meaningful and developmental. You will have study time to work in your curriculum team and to attend College to work towards your qualifications, meet with your personal tutor, plan your own professional development and prepare for end-point assessment.

As an apprentice teacher, you will be assessed using varied methods, including assignments, collaborative presentations, poster presentations and reflections. Alongside this, there will be a minimum of eight observations of practice conducted by the expert tutors in our Teacher Training Academy or by your workplace mentor.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

Achieving the Higher Apprenticeship Assessor-Coach qualification will enable you to develop and assess apprentices, workplace students and workshop training. With apprenticeships expected to expand significantly, it will make an excellent addition to your CV, enhancing your career opportunities and employability.

We can tailor the learning to meet your specific job role and to align with the needs of your employer. The aim is to foster your skills as a professional who has a positive and lasting impact on apprentice and student development.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

To evidence the apprenticeship standards and become an outstanding assessor-coach, you will work towards a set of qualifications bespoke to your own needs and those of your employer. You must achieve:

- a Level 1 qualification in Safeguarding
- a Level 2 Functional Skills qualification in Maths, English and ICT if you do not have these (or their equivalent) at the start of the programme
- an end-point assessment (conducted by an external assessment centre) to show you have evidenced the apprenticeship standards

Depending on your role, your employer may also wish you to achieve:

- a Level 3 Certificate in Assessing Vocational Achievement or Level 2 Award in Assessing Competence in the Workplace
- a Level 3 Award in Education and Training or Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training which will develop your skill set in delivering effective training to groups

The apprenticeship standard consists of:

- planning coaching and assessment
- delivering coaching and support using effective coaching practice
- assessing learners using effective vocational assessments
- supporting quality improvement

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Apprentices may have achieved Maths, English and ICT qualifications at Level 2 (equivalent to GCSE grade C/4 or above) before commencing their training. Those who have not must achieve this before taking the end-point assessment.

They also need a qualification at an appropriate level and relevant, up-todate experience in their vocational/subject-specialism.

Many apprentices will already possess a Level 3 qualification in Assessing. Depending on the specific education and training context, employers (and/or awarding organisations) may require those without an Assessor qualification to achieve this prior to completion of the apprenticeship.

HOW WILL I LEARN?

Learning time is organised on a flexible basis to accommodate your employer's needs and your own needs, although you will normally be required to attend College to achieve the Functional Skills qualifications. There will be developmental observations of your practice.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You will have study time to work with your assessor one-to-one and to attend small group teaching workshops. This will help you prepare for end-point assessment consisting of professional discussion and observation, which will be conducted by an independent assessment centre.

The end-point assessment consists of:

- submission of a showcase of exemplary practice
- a professional discussion informed by the showcase
- observations of assessor-coach practice followed by questions and answers

You could:

- secure a permanent position as an assessor-coach or related role in the FE and Skills sector or in a private sector organisation which employs apprentices

You will improve your understanding of how people learn, how to plan effective and engaging teaching sessions and how to assess – both during the session and through summative assessment. Throughout, you will use theoretical underpinning knowledge to improve your professional practice.

You will explore the context and design of your curriculum, gaining a solid understanding of the external pressures influencing it. You will also have an opportunity to pursue a specific interest in the second year, such as Professional Research Project and Effective Classroom Management.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

Aimed at students who already hold an Honours Degree, our PGCE is an in-service part-time route to a full teacher qualification, offered in partnership with the University of Derby – an ideal 'earn as you learn' route.

It will equip you with the knowledge, skills and professional behaviours you need to become a highly effective teacher in post-14 education, to teach KS4 in a school or academy, or to teach in a college, with a training provider, in a prison or in the voluntary sector.

You will improve your knowledge of how people learn, how to plan effective and engaging teaching sessions and how to assess – both during the session and through summative assessment. Throughout, you will be using theoretical underpinning knowledge to improve your professional practice.

You will also explore the context and design of your curriculum, gaining a solid understanding of the external pressures influencing it. We offer an opportunity for you to pursue a specific interest in the second year, such as Professional Research Project and Effective Classroom Management.

There are also pathway modules in Supporting Learners with Disabilities; Teaching English up to Level 2 in the Post-14 Sector; Training to Teach Maths up to Level 2 in the Post-14 Sector; Teaching Sport in the Post-14 Sector; and Teaching STEM Engineering. This programme is delivered at the Roundhouse and the qualification is awarded by the University of Derby.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

Modules are:

All applicants are subject to approval from the University of Derby.

HOW WILL I LEARN?

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You need to be aged 18 or over at the start of your studies. All applicants will be invited to complete a phone interview or site visit at which interviews will take place to discuss their qualifications, experience and any other related issues. You should have one of the following:

- 64 UCAS points, with at least 32 preferably coming from a related subject such as Public Services, Law or Sociology
- Access to HE qualifications

You also need:

- A Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check, depending on any work placement requirements

HOW WILL I LEARN?

Although you may only be in classes for two days per week, there is an expectation that you will spend the equivalent of a further three days in independent study and undertake a period of mandatory work placement to support your studies. This may involve you being invited in on non-timetabled days or weekends to fulfil some elements of the programme. Please note that classes will take place over traditional half-term holidays that fall within the identified semester weeks.

The programme is delivered by experienced higher education lecturers who have had careers within the uniformed public services such as the police, prison service and army and who can relate security and offender management to a diverse range of scenarios.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

You will be assessed using a variety of methods which may include practical and theory exams, reports and assignments, presentations, and practical work. The assessment methods are designed to review your understanding and knowledge relevant to the sector.

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

It is advisable that you have access to your own laptop for research and assignment writing. To access work placement opportunities, you may need a DBS check, the cost of which will be included as part of your programme fees

Additional trips and visits are usually provided as part of your study programme. However, there may be social or team building opportunities which would incur additional costs of around $\mathfrak{L}15$ -20. In previous years, students have paid around $\mathfrak{L}200$ for a two-night stay in London.

WHY CHOOSE THIS PROGRAMME?

This one-year top-up programme has evolved in response to the expanding nature of the work of criminal justice agencies in both the public and private sectors. It aims to address the skills and knowledge gap faced by the private and voluntary sector tendering for and delivering these services.

This is a unique programme where you will not only learn about the significance of Her Majesty's Prison and Probation Service (HMPPS) but also gain an understanding of how this service, working together with the police, ensures public protection and security. It includes exploring how these services manage violent, sexual and mentally disordered offenders within the custodial environment and the community, and the provision of interventions to reduce re-offending and lower recidivism rates.

You will improve your employability by developing your critical thinking and analytical skills, your scholarship and your intellectual abilities — all of which are transferable. We encourage a focus on independent learning to solve real-life projects and the skills you acquire will equip you for a wide range of careers in the security and offender management industry.

The programme leads to a qualification awarded by the University of Derby. It is delivered at the Roundhouse on two days per week.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

Modules include:

- Mentally Disordered Offenders
- Security, Public Protection and Safer Custody Arrangements
- Interventions to Reduce Offending
- Sexual Violence, Exploitation and Abuse
- Independent Research Project (Dissertation)

It is expected that students will undertake around 72 hours of work placement or experience to enhance their overall employability skills.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All applicants will be invited to an interview to discuss their qualifications, experience and any other related issues. You should have one of the following:

- A HND in Public Services or the equivalent
- A Foundation Degree in a relevant subject such as Criminal Justice or Public Services – students must have attained 120 credits at Level 5

You also need:

• GCSE English and Maths at grades 9 - 4 (A*- C) or the equivalent

Students wishing to progress from any other Level 5 qualification in a relevant subject will be considered on their own merit following a full mapping exercise. All applicants are subject to approval from the University of Derby.

HOW WILL I LEARN?

This is a full-time programme with around ten hours scheduled for taught sessions over two days per week, including lectures and seminars. Therefore it is expected that you will use the remainder of the time for your independent study and work placement.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

The degree will be assessed through a range of assignments and exams including essays, presentations, case studies, assessment reports, independent research projects and practical activities.

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

You need stationery and a USB flash drive. Having your own laptop is also desirable

Additional trips and visits are usually provided as part of your study programme. However, there may be social or team building opportunities which would incur additional costs of around £15-20.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

On successful completion of the programme, you could choose to extend your studies and apply to progress to other higher education provision such as a postgraduate programme, provided that you meet the minimum entry threshold.

Alternatively, you may wish to seek employment in security and offender management related careers, such as the police service, probation services, prison service, social work or youth offending agencies but please note that some of these fields may require further study. The BA (Hons) qualification meets the entry criteria for the degree holder route for joining the police service. There is also the option of pursuing a career within the voluntary sector, working in areas such as the rehabilitation of offenders or with victims.

The design of the Foundation Degree allows you to choose themes of particular interest to you as an individual. You can study and undertake relevant assessments in these topics, making the programme specific to you and the career path you would like to pursue.

There is the chance to go on field trips to put your learning into practice: previous examples include visits to a physiotherapy and rehabilitation centre and a biomechanics lab as well as professional sports clubs to observe coaching in the natural environment and to look at the analysis methods used.

You will also have the chance to undertake work experience by delivering coaching in further education or other settings. We have links with schools and sports clubs in the local community to help you develop your coaching experience and enhance your CV.

You will be taught by highly qualified staff who have excellent academic and practical backgrounds in coaching – from elite level England basketball coaches to grassroots local league coaches.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

There are no formal exams. You will be assessed through a variety of assignments including laboratory-based work, reports, presentations, coaching analysis, essays and practical work.

ARE THERE ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS OR IS SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT REQUIRED?

Although it is not a pre-requisite, it is helpful for you to have your own laptop/tablet to meet the independent study demands of the programme.

Practical sports attire is required in some sessions and you are expected to provide your own. You also have the opportunity to buy a departmental uniform to wear for coaching sessions.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER THIS PROGRAMME?

You will have the opportunity to apply to complete a final top-up year to gain the full BA (Hons) Sport Coaching and Development at the University of Derby.

Coaches are needed at every level of sport participation, with jobs available in schools, National Governing Bodies, councils and sports clubs. You could also consider further study to become a teacher, particularly within primary education, or setting up your own coaching company.

This programme will run with a minimum of eight students.

In training for the 2024 Olympics

With breaking officially confirmed as an Olympic sport, exciting times lie ahead for former DCG student Karam Singh.

Karam, who took the Sport Coaching Foundation Degree at Broomfield Hall, hopes to reach the 2024 Olympics in Paris and bring home a medal. He has been breaking – a competitive form of breakdancing – since he was seven and has risen to rank fourth in the world and first in the UK.

As well as continuing to practise hard, Karam has also been busy studying, recently graduating from the University of Derby in Sports Coaching and Development. Keen on many sports, he always wanted to train as a sports teacher or coach as a back-up to his breaking career.

He firmly believes his DCG studies helped take him to the next level in his sport. "Broomfield Hall is where I learnt about my body and that's where the big transformation came," he explains.

"I learnt how to calorie count, manage fitness levels and train elite athletes. I've managed to apply it to myself and it's helped me a lot."



MONEY MATTERS

Choosing to study a higher education programme is a real investment in your future, leading to better career prospects and greater earning potential. We will provide all the advice and support you need to overcome any financial concerns you may have.

AN AFFORDABLE OPTION

Higher education fees with Derby College Group are relatively modest – usually £6,000 to £7,500 for a full-time programme and £3,000 to £4,500 for a part-time programme. Studying locally also means you will not face significant accommodation and transport costs.

TUITION FEES

You can pay for your higher education programme through:

- a direct payment to us
- sponsorship from an employer
- a student loan

STUDENT LOANS

The Student Loans Company administers financial support for higher education. If you apply for a loan:

- you do not have to pay fees up front
- you do not need to pay back anything until after you have completed your programme and are earning over £27,295 per year
- you will not pay anything back at all if you never reach that salary level

Depending on your household income, you may also be eligible for a maintenance loan to cover your living costs.

APPLYING FOR A LOAN

If you choose to apply for a loan, you will need to complete an online form each year you study. Your tuition fee will automatically be paid to us.

It makes sense to apply for student finance as early as possible. You can do so as soon as finance applications are open and you have accepted an offer – you do not have to wait until you have achieved all your entry grades.

BURSARIES AVAILABLE

DCG offers a range of bursaries for which students can apply at the start of each academic year. If your application is successful, your bursary will be paid throughout the year.



You will be asked to complete a series of questions via an online questionnaire and provide a short personal statement. We especially target our support at students:

- from BME backgrounds
- who live in areas where people do not often progress to higher education
- who are the first in their family to undertake higher education
- with an inclusion need

DISABLED STUDENTS' ALLOWANCE

As a higher education student in England, you can apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) if you have a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010), long-term health condition, mental health condition or specific learning difficulty such as dyslexia. The support depends on your individual needs and not on your income.

The Disabled Students' Allowance pays for extra support to help you make the most of your studies. This could be payment for study skills support, such as dedicated support for dyslexia, or for specialist equipment such as electronic note-taking software.

The application process for the DSA can take up to 14 weeks.

ADVANCED LEARNER LOAN

You could also qualify for a loan if you are on other programmes at Level 3 or above, including our Access to Higher Education diplomas.

The introduction of the Advanced Learner Loan means that even more students aged 19 or over now have access to a financial support package which is similar to that available to university undergraduates.

Rather than having to pay for your fees up front, you can access a loan from the Student Loans Company which you only need to repay once you have completed your studies and when you are earning over £27,295 a year.

The loans are easy to apply for. Your household income and employment status are not taken into account and there are no credit checks.
